Ordinance for

Master of Pharmacy (M. Pharm.) Programme

[Approved by Academic council in its meeting dated 9th July, 2008]

1- Admission:

1.1.- Admission to the M. Pharm. First Semester will be made as per the rules prescribed by the Academic Council of the University.

1.2 – Admission or migration of a candidate from any other University to the U. P. Technical University is not permitted.

2- Eligibility for Admission:

2.1- Admission through Entrance Examination

- (i)** Candidates who have passed B. Pharm. examination from AICTE approved institutions with 60% marks.
- (ii)** Candidates with 60% marks and who are GATE qualified will be given preference over Candidates who are not GATE qualified in affiliated institutions/Colleges of the University where M. Pharm. courses are approved by the AICTE and the University.
- (iii)** The Academic Council shall have the power to amend the eligibility criteria laid down in 2.1 (i) and 2.1 (ii) within the frame work of guidelines of the All India Council of Technical Education.

3- Direct admissions on Vacant/Management seats at Institutions/Colleges level:

The eligibility criteria for direct admissions on seats remaining vacant in the first year after entrance examination counseling as well as for Management seats shall be notified by the University from time to time.

4- Maximum Duration of Stay:

The maximum duration of stay of a student enrolled in M. Pharm. courses shall be four academic years.

5- Cancellation of Admission:

The admission of a student at any stage of study shall be cancelled if:

- (i) He / She is not found qualified as per AICTE norms/guidelines or the eligibility criteria prescribed by the University.
Or
- (ii) He / She is found unable to complete the course within the four academic years of courses at section 3.
Or
- (iii) He / She is found involved in creating indiscipline in the Institute / College or in the University.

6- Attendance:

Students are expected to attend 100% classes. Normally student shall be allowed to appear in a semester examination unless he/she has put in 75% attendance in all the theory/practical subjects in that semester. Attendance for dissertation work in third and fourth semester shall be verified by the supervisor/guide. However, an additional shortage by an amount not exceeding 15% of the total number of lectures delivered or practical work done in each subject may be condoned for special reasons as given below.

- (a) A shortage upto 5% of the total number of lectures delivered or practical work done in each subject may be condoned by the Head of the Department.
- (b) A further shortage upto 10% may be condoned by the Director/Principal of the Institute/College or the Dean of Faculty of the University on the specific recommendation of the concerned Head of Department.

7- Examination:

- (a) End semester examination shall be held as per the scheme of examination announced by the University.
- (b) The examination may be conducted by means of written papers, practical and oral tests, project/dissertation work or by means of any combination of these methods.
- (c) The examination for theory papers and evaluation of sessionals shall be conducted at the end of each semester.
- (d) A student enrolled in any one of the M. Pharm. courses shall be allowed to submit the dissertation with due permission of the

supervisor/guide at least 46 weeks after getting registered in third semester but in any case not more than four academic years from admission to the course.

(e) The supervisor/guide of the dissertation will be a regular faculty member of the department running the course.

(f) Dissertation Examination :

The dissertation shall be sent to one external examiner. On receiving satisfactory report, a viva-voce examination shall be conducted by a panel of the following examiners:

- i. Head of the Department.
- ii. External Examiner who evaluated the dissertation.
- iii. Supervisor(s)/Guide(s)

8- Declaration of Result:

A candidate shall be declared pass in a semester if he/she obtains:

(a) 40% marks in each end semester theory paper/practical examination and 50% marks in the total sum of theory papers/practicals examination and concerned sessional marks.

(b) 50% marks in dissertation examination.

(c) 50% marks in the grand total of the semester examination.

(d)(i) For candidates admitted in courses 3(a), (b) and (c) :

A candidate who satisfies the requirement of Ordinance 8 (c) but fails to satisfy the requirement of Ordinance 8 (a) in not more than four theory papers/practicals in 1st & 2nd semester examination shall be allowed for promotion to the next semester. Hence, a candidate who fails in not more than two theory papers/practicals each in first and second semester examinations (i.e. not more than 4 theory / practicals at the end of 2nd semsester) shall be eligible for promotion to third semester.

(ii) For passing in back papers, a candidate must fulfil the requirement of Ordinance 8 (a) in those theory paper(s) or practical(s) in which he/she failed.

- (iii) The marks awarded to candidate in back paper / special examination shall replace the previous marks.
- (iv) A candidate who satisfies the requirement of Ordinance 8 (c) but does not satisfy the requirement of Ordinance 8 (d) (i) shall be required to repeat the semester as a regular student or as an ex-student. In case of a regular student, he/she will be given re-admission in the semester and the remaining conditions will be at par as for the fresh candidates. In case of ex-student, he/she shall be allowed to appear in the end semester examination after he/she fills in the examination form and deposits the examination fees. However, his/her sessional mark will remain unaltered for declaration of result. A candidate declared promoted may also have an option to repeat the semester as a regular student only. The failed candidate opting for Ex-studentship shall be required to register in the Institute/College within 15 days after the declaration of result.

9. Declaration of Division :

Division shall be awarded only in the final semester examination on the basis of grand total of marks obtained in all the semester examinations of the course. The award of division shall be carried on the following basis:

- (a) Candidate obtaining 50% or more but less than 60% of the grand total
.....SECOND DIVISION.
- (b) Candidate obtaining 60% or more but less than 75% of the grand total
.....FIRST DIVISION.
- (c) Candidate obtaining 75% or more of the grand total
.....FIRST DIVISION with
HONOURS.

10. Merit List:

A candidate who passes all the examination in one attempt shall be eligible to inclusion in the merit list and shall be eligible for award of any medal.

11. Grace Marks:

A candidate shall be entitled for the award of grace marks upto a maximum of five marks in any one of the theory papers / practicals to pass a semester

examination. No grace marks shall be awarded in back paper / special examination. The grace marks shall not be added to the grand total for the purpose of awarding division or honours.

12. Scrutiny:

A candidate shall be entitled for the scrutiny of his/her examination result according to the regulation laid down by the University.

13. Unfair means :

Cases of unfair means shall be dealt as per the rules of the University and The U.P. Public Examination (Prevention of Unfair means) Act if any in prevalence.

14. Special Examination :

A special examination shall be held after second / fourth semester examination for the benefit of those candidates admitted in courses 3 (a), (b) and (c) / course 3 (d) respectively provided they qualify for promotion with back paper(s), normally along with the junior batches.

15. Sessional Evaluation :

(a) Sessional marks for theory subjects / practicals shall be awarded on the basis of :

- (i). Performance in tests / viva-voce.
- (ii). Performance in tutorials / practical records.
- (iii). Regularity in attendance.

The distribution of sessional marks for theory subjects / practicals shall be as follows :

(a) Theory subject

Test	50%
Tutorial	30%
Attendance	20%

(b) Practicals

Viva-voce	30%
Practical Record	50%
Attendance	20%

(b) The sessional marks for the dissertation shall be awarded jointly by the supervisor(s)/ guides, Head of the Department and a Senior Faculty Member of the Department.
